16 17 18	WHEREAS, Stroke occurs at a rate of 1 in 1,600 to 1 in 4,000 live births each year and 12 in 100,000 children per year, with stroke being the sixth–leading cause of death in children; and
19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, Between 50% and 85% of infants and children who have a pediatric stroke will have permanent neurological disabilities, including paralysis and seizures speech and vision problems, and attention, learning, and behavioral difficulties, and may require ongoing physical therapy, educational interventions, and rehabilitative treatment and

WHEREAS, The lifelong health challenges and treatments resulting from pediatric

stroke place a significant financial and emotional toll on the child, the family, and our

- WHEREAS, Since very little is known regarding the cause, treatment, and prevention of pediatric stroke, including risk factors, symptoms, and prevention efforts, and treatments for stroke are often different for children from treatments for adults; and
- WHEREAS, Early diagnosis and treatment of pediatric stroke greatly improves the chance of recovery and preventing recurrence; and
- WHEREAS, Only through continued medical research can effective treatment and prevention strategies for pediatric stroke be identified and developed; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Increased awareness of pediatric stroke and support for further 10 research will lead to earlier diagnosis of and more effective treatment for pediatric stroke 11 and greatly improve the chances of recovery and preventing recurrence; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (A) THE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE MARYLAND
 17 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, SHALL PROMOTE AWARENESS IN AND PROVIDE
 18 TRAINING FOR DIRECTORS OF STUDENT SERVICES IN LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCIES
 19 REGARDING PEDIATRIC STROKE.
- 20 (B) THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SHALL PROVIDE TO THE
 21 DEPARTMENT, FOR DISTRIBUTION TO LOCAL SCHOOL SUPERVISORS OF HEALTH,
 22 RESOURCE INFORMATION ON PEDIATRIC STROKE, INCLUDING INFORMATION ON
 23 THE WARNING SIGNS OF PEDIATRIC STROKE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2019.
