Watson, Arikan, Cox, and Malone Introduced and read first time: February 1, 2019 Assigned to: Judiciary Committee Report: Favorable with amendments House action: Adopted Read second time: March 30, 2019 CHAPTER AN ACT concerning Crimes - Solicitation and Conspiracy to Commit Murder - Penalty Resulting in Death (Stacey's Law) FOR the purpose of providing that the statute of limitations for the crime of solicitation to commit murder in the first degree where the death of another did not occur is 3 years: providing that a person who solicits another or conspires with another to commit murder in the first degree is guilty of a felony, if the death of another occurs as a result of the solicitation or conspiracy; establishing a certain penalty; providing for the application of this Act; clarifying that a person who solicits another or conspires with another to commit murder in the first degree is guilty of murder in the first degree if the death of another occurs as a result of the solicitation or conspiracy; and generally relating to solicitation and conspiracy to commit murder.
