A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Political Subdivisions - Legal Notice Requirements - Posting on Websites

FOR the purpose of authorizing a county or municipality to satisfy a requirement to publish legal notices in a newspaper of general circulation by posting the notices on the county's or municipality's website; requiring notices posted on a county or municipality website to be displayed conspicuously and to be easily accessible; requiring a county or municipality that chooses to post notices on the Internet to publish certain advance notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the county or municipality and to offer a certain mail service to provide paper copies of notices; requiring the mail service to provide paper copies of notices posted on the website of a county or municipality in a certain time period; providing that the mail subscription shall be valid for a certain period of time and may be renewed; requiring a county or municipality to provide information about the mail service on the county's or municipality's website and in certain notices; requiring a county or municipality to maintain paper copies of notices posted on the county's or municipality's website and to make the copies available to the public; requiring a county or municipality to maintain an affidavit stating certain information about the posting of a notice on the county's or municipality's website; providing that the affidavit is not required to be notarized; and generally relating to publication of legal notices by counties and municipalities.

WHEREAS, There has been a steady decline in newspaper readership in the past several decades, while at the same time there has been a significant increase in the number

WHEREAS, Baltimore City, the 23 counties in Maryland, and many municipalities maintain official government websites that are accessible to the public 24 hours a day; and

WHEREAS, Many legal notices published solely in newspapers go unread and unnoticed by the public because casual newspaper readers generally do not read the legal notice section but instead follow local government issues through the Internet; and

WHEREAS, Allowing the publication of legal notices on official government websites, while still giving the option to receive notice by mail, will make those notices more easily accessible to a greater number of people, thereby promoting increased public participation in government; and

WHEREAS, Like the State, many political subdivisions in Maryland will face significant fiscal challenges, including static or declining property tax revenues, decreased State aid, and potentially significant new federal and State mandates; and

WHEREAS, Every dollar spent on publishing legal notices in newspapers places further stress on local budgets, and the counties and Baltimore City could save millions of dollars annually if they were to publish via the Internet; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 (II)CONSPICUOUSLY \mathbf{BE} DISPLAYED AND \mathbf{BE} **EASILY** 20ACCESSIBLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC ON THE WEBSITE OF THE COUNTY OR 21**MUNICIPALITY**; AND
- 22(III) BE PRINTED IN THE ANNUAL NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER 23SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

- 1 (2) MAKE THE COPIES AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC IN 2 ACCORDANCE WITH THE MARYLAND PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT.
- 3 (E) (1) FOR A LEGAL NOTICE POSTED ON THE WEBSITE OF A COUNTY OR
 4 MUNICIPALITY, THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY SHALL MAINTAIN AN AFFIDAVIT
 5 THAT STATES THE INITIAL DATE THROUGH THE LAST DATE THAT A NOTICE WAS
 6 PUBLISHED ON THE WEBSITE OF THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY.
- 7 (2) THE AFFIDAVIT REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 8 SUBSECTION IS NOT REQUIRED TO BE NOTARIZED.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2019.
