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Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Telemedicine – Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health, under certain 5 circumstances, to include psychiatric nurse practitioners who are providing 6 Assertive Community Treatment or mobile treatment services to certain Maryland 7 Medical Assistance Program recipients in the types of providers eligible to receive 8 reimbursement for health care services that are delivered through telemedicine and 9 provided to Program recipients; providing that a certain health care service provided through telemedicine by a certain psychiatric nurse practitioner is equivalent to the 10 11 same health care service when provided through an in-person consultation for a 12 certain purpose; requiring the Department to report to certain committees of the 13 General Assembly on certain matters on or before a certain date; and generally 14 relating to the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and telemedicine.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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24 (a) The Program shall reimburse health care providers in accordance with the 25 requirements of Title 19, Subtitle 1, Part IV of this article.

That enables the patient to see and interact with the 14 health care provider at the time the health care service is provided to the patient. "Telemedicine" does not include: 15 2. 16 An audio-only telephone conversation between a health 17 care provider and a patient; 18 В. An electronic mail message between a health care provider 19 and a patient; or 20 C.  7 established by the Department, a health care service provided through telemedicine by a
 8 psychiatrist **OR A PSYCHIATRIC NURSE PRACTITIONER** described under subparagraph
 9 (ii)2 of this paragraph is equivalent to the same health care service when provided through
 10 an in–person consultation.
- 11 (5) The Department may require a health care provider to submit a 12 registration form to the Department that includes information required for the processing 13 of claims for reimbursement for health care services provided to Program recipients under 14 this subsection.
- 15 (6) The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out this subsection.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before September 30, 2021, the Maryland Department of Health shall report, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee on the effect on Medical Assistance Program general fund expenditures of reimbursing telemedicine services from psychiatric nurse practitioners who are providing Assertive Community Treatment or mobile treatment services, as required by Section 1 of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2019.
