7 8 9	(a) (1) In this section, "agricultural building" means a structure designed and constructed to house farm implements, hay, grain, poultry, livestock, or other horticultural products.
10	(2) "Agricultural building" does not include a place of human residence.
11	(b) This section applies only to:

17 18	(2) a county where the local legislative body has approved the application of this section to the county.
19 20	(c) The Standards do not apply to the construction, alteration, or modification of an agricultural building for which agritourism is an intended subordinate use.
21 22 23	(d) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, an existing agricultural building used for agritourism is not considered a change of occupancy that requires a building permit if the subordinate use of agritourism:
24 25	(1) is in accordance with limitations set forth in regulations adopted by the Department;
26 27	(2) occupies only levels of the building on which a ground level exit is located; and
28 29	(3) does not require more than 50 people to occupy an individual building at any one time.

13 14	(ii) any other requirements of the Standards or other building codes as set forth in regulations adopted by the Department.
15	(g) The Department shall adopt regulations to implement this section.
