### CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 **Maryland Longitudinal Data System – Student Data and Governing Board**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the types of records included in and excluded from the  
4 definition of “student data” for purposes of the Maryland Longitudinal Data System;  
5 adding the Department of Juvenile Services to the entities required to provide data  
6 sets to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System; adding the Secretary of Juvenile  
7 Services or a certain designee to the governing board of the Maryland Longitudinal  
8 Data System Center; altering the type of data certain entities are required to  
9 transfer to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System; and generally relating to the  
10 Maryland Longitudinal Data System.

11 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,  
12 Article – Education  
13 Section 24–701(a) and (b) and 24–704(a)  
14 Annotated Code of Maryland

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – Education**

24–701.

(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) “Center” means the Maryland Longitudinal Data System Center.

(f) (1) “Student data” means data relating to **OR IMPACTING** student performance.

(2) “Student data” includes:

(i) State and national assessments;

(ii) Course-taking and completion;

(iii) Grade point average;

(iv) Remediation;

(v) Retention;

(vi) Degree, diploma, or credential attainment;

(vii) Enrollment; [and]

(viii) Demographic data;

**(IX) JUVENILE DELINQUENCY RECORDS; AND**

**(X) ~~DISCIPLINE~~ ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL DISCIPLINARY RECORDS.**

(3) “Student data” does not include:

- 1 (i) [Juvenile delinquency records;  
 2 (ii)] Criminal and CINA records; AND  
 3 [(iii)] **(II)** Medical and health records[; and  
 4 (iv) Discipline records].

6 (f) The Center shall perform the following functions and duties:

7 (1) Serve as a central repository of student data and workforce data in the  
 8 Maryland Longitudinal Data System, including data sets provided by:

- 9 (i) The State Department of Education;  
 10 (ii) Local education agencies;  
 11 (iii) The Maryland Higher Education Commission;  
 12 (iv) Institutions of higher education; [and]  
 13 (v) The Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; AND

14 **(VI) THE DEPARTMENT OF ~~JUVENILE~~ JUVENILE SERVICES;**

15 (2) Oversee and maintain the warehouse of the Maryland Longitudinal  
 16 Data System data sets;

17 (3) Ensure routine and ongoing compliance with the federal Family  
 18 Educational Rights and Privacy Act and other relevant privacy laws and policies, including:

- 19 (i) The required use of de-identified data in data research and  
 20 reporting;  
 21 (ii) The required disposition of information that is no longer needed;  
 22 (iii) Providing data security, including the capacity for audit trails;  
 23 (iv) Providing for performance of regular audits for compliance with  
 24 data privacy and security standards; and  
 25 (v) Implementing guidelines and policies that prevent the reporting  
 26 of other potentially identifying data;

1 (4) Conduct research using timely and accurate student data and  
2 workforce data to improve the State's education system and guide decision making by State  
3 and local governments, educational agencies, institutions, teachers, and other education  
4 professionals;

5 (5) Conduct research relating to:

6 (i) The impact of State and federal education programs;

7 (ii) The performance of educator preparation programs; and

8 (iii) Best practices regarding classroom instruction, education  
9 programs and curriculum, and segment alignment;

10 (6) Fulfill information and data requests to facilitate State and federal  
11 education reporting with existing State agencies as appropriate; and

12 (7) Fulfill approved public information requests.

14 (a) There is a Governing Board of the Center.

15 (b) The Governing Board shall include the following members:

16 (1) The Secretary of Higher Education, or the Secretary's designee;

17 (2) The Chancellor of the University System of Maryland, or the  
18 Chancellor's designee;

19 (3) The President of Morgan State University, or the President's designee;

20 (4) The State Superintendent of Schools, or the Superintendent's designee;

21 **(5) THE SECRETARY OF JUVENILE SERVICES, OR THE SECRETARY'S**  
22 **DESIGNEE;**

23 **[(5)] (6)** The Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, or the  
24 Secretary's designee;

25 **[(6)] (7)** A representative of local superintendents of schools, appointed  
26 by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate;

27 **[(7)] (8)** The Executive Director of the Maryland Association of  
28 Community Colleges, or the Executive Director's designee;

1            **[(8) (9)]**     The President of the Maryland Independent College and  
2 University Association, or the President’s designee; and

3            **[(9) (10)]**   Four members of the public, appointed by the Governor with the  
4 advice and consent of the Senate.

5 24–707.

6            (a)     Local education agencies, community colleges, public senior higher education  
7 institutions, and State agencies shall:

8                    (1)     Make every effort to comply with the data requirements and  
9 implementation schedule for the Maryland Longitudinal Data System as set forth by the  
10 Governing Board; and

11                   (2)     Transfer **[student–level and transcript–level]** **STUDENT** data and  
12 workforce data to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System in accordance with the data  
13 security and safeguarding plan developed under § 24–704(g)(6) of this subtitle.

14            SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
15 October 1, 2019.
