A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Senatorial and Delegate Scholarships - Certification and Licensure Courses at 3 Community Colleges - Use of Scholarship

- 4 FOR the purpose of repealing a requirement that certain recipients of a senatorial $\mathbf{5}$ scholarship use the scholarship to reimburse certain expenses; authorizing certain 6 recipients of a senatorial scholarship who are currently enrolled in a certificate or 7 license program or certain courses or sequences of courses to use the scholarship for 8 certain expenses; authorizing a certain recipient of a senatorial scholarship to hold 9 the scholarship for a certain period of time; repealing a requirement that certain recipients of a delegate scholarship use the scholarship to reimburse certain 10 11 expenses; authorizing a student enrolled in a certificate or license program or for 12certain courses or sequences of courses at a community college to use a delegate 13 scholarship for certain educational expenses; and generally relating to senatorial 14and delegate scholarships.

- 25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

$3 \\ 4 \\ 5$	(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to § 18–406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient:
6	(1) Is a full–time student;
7	(2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and
8 9 10	(3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate student each semester leading to a degree.
11 12	(b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if the recipient:
13	(1) Is a part–time student;
14	(2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and
$\begin{array}{c} 15\\ 16\end{array}$	(3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree.
17 18	(c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one-half of the yearly award for summer school.
19 20 21 22 23	(d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate program as provided in § $18-402(a)(1)$ of this subtitle may hold the scholarship for 2 years if the recipient is a full-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a) of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if the recipient is a part-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (b) of this section.
24 25 26 27 28	(e) (1) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is currently enrolled [, or was enrolled within the last 2 years,] in a certificate or license program, course, or sequence of courses at a community college that leads to certification or licensure, as provided in § 18–402(a)(3) of this subtitle, may use the scholarship [to reimburse educational] FOR THE expenses [as defined by the Office] LISTED under § 18–405(b)(2) of this subtitle.
29 30 31 32	(2) A RECIPIENT OF A SENATORIAL SCHOLARSHIP WHO IS ENROLLED IN A CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM, COURSE, OR SEQUENCE OF COURSES AT A COMMUNITY COLLEGE THAT LEADS TO CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE MAY HOLD THE SCHOLARSHIP:

21 22 23 24 25 26	(a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18–503 through 18–505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, during each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal to four times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at the University of Maryland, College Park Campus for the academic year commencing in that year.
27	(b) A scholarship award under subsection (a) of this section:
$28 \\ 29$	(1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one-half of the total amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) of this section for that year;
30	(2) Shall be used at an eligible institution;
31	(3) May be used by:

(i) A graduate, undergraduate, or professional student; 1 $\mathbf{2}$ (ii) A student at a private career school within the State that is 3 approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11-202 of this article 4 and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United States Department of Education; or $\mathbf{5}$ 6 (iii) A student who is currently enrolled [or was enrolled in the last 2 7years] in a certificate or license program, course, or sequence of courses at a community college that leads to certification or licensure [as reimbursement] for educational expenses 8 9 that [are defined by the Office and] include tuition, mandatory fees, and room and board; 10 and (4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be recredited to the 11 12Delegate's scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 months by that Delegate 13to another student pursuant to this section. 14SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019. 15
