  residential service agency ensure that certain individuals receive certain training;

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.



- 1 (e) (1) "Residential service agency" means any person that is engaged in a nongovernmental business of employing or contracting with individuals to provide home 3 health care for compensation to an unrelated sick or disabled individual in the residence of that individual.
- 5 (2) "Residential service agency" includes any agency that employs or 6 contracts with individuals directly for hire as home health care providers.
- 7 (3) "Residential service agency" does not include:
- 8 (i) A home health agency that is licensed under the provisions of 9 Subtitle 4 of this title;
- 10 (ii) A person required to be licensed as a home health agency under 11 the provisions of Subtitle 4 of this title;
- 12 (iii) A home-based hospice care program that is licensed under the provisions of Subtitle 9 of this title;
- 14 (iv) A hospital that is licensed under the provisions of Subtitle 3 of 15 this title;
- 16 (v) A related institution that is licensed under the provisions of 17 Subtitle 3 of this title:
- 18 (vi) Personal care providers under the Medical Assistance Personal 19 Care Program;
- 20 (vii) Any person practicing a health occupation that the person is 21 authorized to practice under the Health Occupations Article;
- (viii) A nursing referral service agency that is licensed under Subtitle 4B of this title;
- 24 (ix) A group of persons licensed under the same title of the Health 25 Occupations Article practicing as a business; or
- 26 (x) Residential rehabilitation services providers approved under regulations adopted by the State Mental Health Authority.
