Economic Development – Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland

4 FOR the purpose of renaming the Regional Additive Manufacturing Partnership of 5 Maryland to be the Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland; 6 renaming the Regional Additive Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland Fund to be 7 the Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland Fund; expanding 8 the purposes of the Partnership; altering the number and composition of the voting 9 members of the Executive Board; requiring the Board to expand certain 10 apprenticeship opportunities; requiring the Partnership to report certain information annually to the Governor and the General Assembly; requiring the 11 12 Partnership to submit certain information to the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; requiring the Department of Commerce and the Department of 13 Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to consider certain requests for financial support 14 15 in their annual budget recommendations; expanding the political subdivisions that may provide financial support to the Partnership; altering the composition of the 16 17 Fund; altering certain definitions; making conforming changes; and generally 18 relating to the Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland.
