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Public Safety - Crisis Intervention Team Technical Assistance Center

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Crisis Intervention Team Technical Assistance Center 4 in the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission; requiring the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to appoint certain 5 6 coordinators to the Technical Assistance Center; requiring the Technical Assistance 7 Center to take certain actions; establishing the Collaborative Planning and 8 Implementation Committee for the Technical Assistance Center; providing for the 9 membership of the Collaborative Committee; providing for the appointment of 10 members of the Collaborative Committee; prohibiting a member of the Collaborative 11 Committee from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing reimbursement of 12 certain expenses; requiring the Collaborative Committee to review and make certain 13 recommendations relating to crisis intervention and the Technical Assistance Center; providing for an appropriation to the operation of the Technical Assistance 14 15 Center; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Crisis Intervention 16 Team Technical Assistance Center.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
