## 2 Public Safety – Crisis Intervention Team Technical Assistance Center

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Crisis Intervention Team Technical Assistance Center 4 in the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission Governor's Office of  $\mathbf{5}$ Crime Control and Prevention; requiring authorizing the Department of Public 6 Safety and Correctional Services Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention 7 to appoint hire, as provided in the State budget, certain <del>coordinators to</del> individuals 8 for the Technical Assistance Center; requiring and authorizing the Technical 9 Assistance Center to take certain actions; establishing the Collaborative Planning 10 and Implementation Committee for the Technical Assistance Center; providing for the membership of the Collaborative Committee; providing for the appointment of 11 12members of the Collaborative Committee; prohibiting a member of the Collaborative 13 Committee from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing reimbursement of 14certain expenses; requiring the Collaborative Committee to review and make certain 15recommendations relating to crisis intervention and the Technical Assistance 16 Center; providing for an appropriation to the operation of the Technical Assistance 17Center; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Crisis Intervention 18 Team Technical Assistance Center.
