2 Environment – Reduction of Lead Risk in Housing – Elevated Blood Lead Levels 3 and Environmental Investigations 4 (Maryland Healthy Children Act)

5 FOR the purpose of reducing the elevated blood lead level after a certain date that initiates 6 certain case management, notification, and lead risk reduction requirements; 7 altering certain notification requirements triggered by the receipt of the results of a 8 certain blood test; requiring the Department of the Environment to conduct a adopt 9 certain regulations, on or before a certain date, for conducting certain environmental investigation within a certain number of days when a child under a certain age or a 10 woman who is pregnant has a certain elevated blood lead level investigations in 11 accordance with certain requirements; requiring the Department to include a 12 13 summary of the results of certain investigations in a certain report; requiring the owner of a certain affected property to satisfy a certain risk reduction standard 14 15 within 30 days after receiving a certain written notice; altering a certain definition; 16 defining a certain terms term; and generally relating to the prevention of lead 17 poisoning and the reduction of lead risk in housing.





- [(r)] (S) "Relocation expenses" means all expenses necessitated by the relocation of a tenant's household to lead-safe housing, including moving and hauling expenses, the HEPA-vacuuming of all upholstered furniture, payment of a security deposit for the lead-safe housing, and installation and connection of utilities and appliances.
- [(s)] (T) "Rent subsidy" means the difference between the rent paid by a tenant for housing at the time a qualified offer is made under Part V of this subtitle and the rent due for the lead–safe housing to which the tenant is relocated.
- 8 **[(t)] (U)** (1) "Rental dwelling unit" means a room or group of rooms that form 9 a single independent habitable rental unit for permanent occupation by one or more 10 individuals that has living facilities with permanent provisions for living, sleeping, eating, 11 cooking, and sanitation.

- 13 (i) An area not used for living, sleeping, eating, cooking, or 14 sanitation, such as an unfinished basement;
