BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 16 18-3005. 17 18 To qualify for participation in the Program, an individual shall: 19 (1)1. Be a student enrolled at a public or private nonprofit institution of higher education in the State that possesses a certificate of approval from the 20 21 Commission; and 22 Maintain a cumulative [3.0] **2.0** grade point average on a 2. 23 4.0 scale each academic year:



1 2 3	(ii) 1. Within 12 months before the date of application for the Program, have graduated from a public or private nonprofit institution of higher education in the State that possesses a certificate of approval from the Commission; and
4 5 6	2. Have maintained a cumulative [3.0] 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale during the latest academic year the individual was enrolled as a student;
7 8 9	(iii) 1. Be a student enrolled at a public or private nonprofit institution of higher education outside the State, if the student graduated from a high school in the State; and
10 11	2. Maintain a cumulative [3.0] 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale each academic year; or
12 13 14	(iv) 1. Have been honorably discharged from the United States armed forces, the National Guard, or a reserve component of the United States armed forces within 18 months of the date of application;
15	2. Be a resident of Maryland; and
16 17	3. Have graduated from a public or private nonprofit institution of higher education;
18 19	(2) Commit to working a minimum of 120 hours during a spring, fall, or summer semester;
20	(3) Attend an orientation session provided or approved by UMBC; and
21	(4) Meet any other criteria established by UMBC.
22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
