3 FOR the purpose of providing that certain provisions of law do not prohibit a certain physician from personally dispensing a prepackaged certain topical medication; 4 establishing a certain exception to the requirement to receive a certain written  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 permit; authorizing a physician to dispense a certain topical medication if the 7 physician meets certain requirements; authorizing the State Board of Physicians to 8 issue a certain written permit to certain physicians under certain circumstances; 9 defining a certain term; and generally relating to the dispensing of a prepackaged 10 topical topical medication by a physician.
