A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Pharmacists - Aids for the Cessation of Tobacco Product Use - Prescribing and Dispensing

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a pharmacist who meets the requirements of certain $\mathbf{5}$ regulations to prescribe and dispense certain aids for the cessation of the use of 6 tobacco products; requiring the State Board of Pharmacy, on or before a certain date, 7 to adopt regulations establishing certain procedures and conditions relating to the 8 prescribing and dispensing of certain aids for the cessation of the use of tobacco 9 products; requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the Maryland Children's Health Program to provide coverage for certain services rendered by a 10 11 licensed pharmacist under this Act to the same extent as certain services rendered 12by any other licensed health care practitioner; altering certain definitions; and 13 generally relating to the prescribing and dispensing of aids for the cessation of the 14 use of tobacco products.
