17 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, on 18 retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive a normal service retirement 19 allowance that equals:

(I) the number of years of the member's creditable service ON OR
 BEFORE JUNE 30, 2019, multiplied by 2% of the member's average final compensation;

1 SERVICE ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2019, MULTIPLIED BY 2.5% OF THE MEMBER'S 2 AVERAGE FINAL COMPENSATION.

3 (2) A member's normal service retirement allowance under paragraph (1) 4 of this subsection may not exceed [65%] **70%** of the member's average final compensation.

5 (3) (i) This paragraph applies only to a member who is not subject to 6 the Law Enforcement Officers' Modified Pension Benefit under Subtitle 2, Part II of this 7 title.

8 (ii) On retirement under this paragraph, the member is entitled to 9 receive a normal service retirement allowance that equals:

10 1. 2.3% of the member's average final compensation 11 multiplied by each year of the member's first 30 years of creditable service; and

12 2. 1% of the member's average final compensation multiplied
13 by each year of creditable service in excess of 30 years.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2019.
