## Kent County Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2019

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a holder of a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license in Kent 4 County to sell alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption as well as 5 on-premises consumption; repealing a certain provision of law concerning Sunday 6 sales under a Class D license; increasing the maximum number of rooms that a 7 facility with a Class B (country inn) beer, wine, and liquor license may offer to the 8 public as sleeping accommodations; decreasing the minimum number of 9 permanently installed seats required in a theater with a theater beer, wine, and 10 liquor license; authorizing a licensed theater to regularly present cinematic as well 11 as live entertainment; altering the hours of sale for a licensed theater; and generally 12 relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Kent County.
