## A BILL ENTITLED

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Correctional Officers' Retirement 5 System to include certain individuals serving in certain positions in the Department 6 of Public Safety and Correctional Services; requiring the State Retirement Agency, 7 on or before a certain date, to notify certain individuals affected by this Act of their 8 right to transfer service credit to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; 9 providing for the application of this Act; requiring a certain transfer and combination of certain service credit for certain individuals; requiring the Board of Trustees for 10 11 the State Retirement and Pension System to calculate a certain disability benefit for 12 certain individuals and to grant a certain benefit under certain circumstances; and 13 generally relating to membership in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.



(b) An individual described under subsection (a) of this section shall have the individual's service credit from the Employees' Pension System transferred and combined with the individual's service in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

- (c) If an individual described under subsection (a) of this section is granted an ordinary disability benefit under Title 29, Subtitle 1 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall calculate the ordinary disability benefit under §§ 29–106 and 29–108 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article and grant the individual the greater benefit.
- 9 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2019.
