## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Congressional Districting Plan – Sixth and Eighth Congressional District
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- FOR the purpose of establishing the composition of the sixth and eighth districts in the State of Maryland for the election of members to the United States House of Representatives; specifying certain election district and precinct boundaries; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the reconfiguration of congressional districts in the State.

- WHEREAS, The census mandated under Article I, § 2 of the U.S. Constitution informs the decennial reapportionment and redistricting process, with the last census
- 21 having occurred in 2010; and
- WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland entered into a Special Session in
- 23 2011 for the purpose of adopting Maryland's congressional districts for the following 10
- 24 years; and

- WHEREAS, The U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland, sitting as a 1 2 three-judge panel which included a judge from the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth 3 Circuit, ruled in November 2018 that Maryland's Sixth Congressional District violates the 4 First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, and in its judgment issued on November 7, 2018, stated, "...the State might be well advised to establish a neutral commission to develop a 5 6 conforming plan", and entered an order (1) permanently enjoining the State "from 7 conducting any further elections for members of the U.S. House of Representatives from 8 Maryland under the 2011 congressional redistricting plan" and (2) directing the State to 9 adopt promptly a new congressional redistricting plan that addresses "the constitutional 10 violations found here with respect to [the Sixth] District" for use in the 2020 election; and
- WHEREAS, On November 26, 2018, the Governor of Maryland issued Executive Order 01.01.2018.29, which established an Emergency Commission on Sixth Congressional District Gerrymandering (the "Commission") for the purpose of redrawing the Sixth District and any other districts necessary to conform the Sixth District to requirements of the First Amendment; and
- WHEREAS, The Commission held public meetings and work sessions to consider how best to redraw the Sixth District; and
- WHEREAS, On March 1, 2019, the Commission made recommendations to redraw the Sixth and Eighth districts on the basis of compactness and geographic contiguity and without regard to any partisan considerations and held two public hearings in the two newly proposed districts to obtain input from citizens on the proposed new districts; and
- WHEREAS, This Act implements the recommendations of the Commission on redrawing the Sixth and Eighth Congressional districts; and
- WHEREAS, Failure to adopt a new plan for the Sixth Congressional District could result in the U.S. District Court adopting its own plan with little or no input from State policy makers; and
- WHEREAS, The integrity of the redistricting process is essential to the success of democracy; and
- WHEREAS, The process of redistricting should be fully transparent and subject to public input and scrutiny; and
- WHEREAS, Free and fair elections are the right of every citizen in the United States, and the map proposed by the Commission will enable a large number of Maryland voters to participate more fully in congressional elections; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 8–707 and 8–709 of Article – Election Law of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

21 22 23	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to

each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is

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enacted.
