13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15	Article – Labor and Employment
16	3–1303.
17	(a) This subtitle does not apply to an employee who:
18	(1) regularly works less than 12 hours a week for an employer;
19	(2) (i) is employed in the construction industry; and
20 21	(ii) is covered by a bona fide collective bargaining agreement in which the requirements of this subtitle are expressly waived in clear and unambiguous

2 3	(3) (i) is called to work by the employer on an as-needed basis in a health or human services industry;
4	(ii) can reject or accept the shift offered by the employer;
5	(iii) is not guaranteed to be called on to work by the employer; and
6	(iv) is not employed by a temporary staffing agency; OR
7 8	(4) REGULARLY WORKS AT A FACILITY AT WHICH THE EMPLOYER OFFERS THE EMPLOYEE ACCESS TO AN ON–SITE HEALTH CLINIC THAT:
9 10	(I) HAS OPERATING COSTS OF AT LEAST \$1,000,000 PER YEAR; AND
11 12	(II) PROVIDES THE EMPLOYEE ACCESS TO DISCOUNTED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.
13 14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2019.
