BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Chapter 307 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2018 Section 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Chapter 307 of the Acts of 2018 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: There is a Task Force to Study Cooperative Purchasing for Health Insurance. (a) (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

The Procurement Advisor shall be the chair of the Task Force.

1 The Department of Budget and Management and the Maryland Insurance (d) 2 Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force. 3 A member of the Task Force: (e) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but 4 (1) 5 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 6 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 7 In order to pool public employee health care purchasing by the State, counties, municipal corporations, and county boards to maximize value while maintaining a broad 8 9 package of benefits and reasonable premiums, the Task Force shall: 10 (1) study models of cooperative purchasing of health insurance; 11 (2) recommend the health insurance benefit options that should be offered 12 to: 13 nonprofit organizations that qualify and elect to participate in 14 the State health plan; 15 county, municipal corporation, and county board employees; (ii) 16 (iii) a surviving spouse, child, or dependent parent of a county, municipal corporation, or county board employee who died while employed by the State; 17 18 and 19 (iv) a retired county, municipal corporation, or county board 20 employee; 21(3)recommend ways to: 22 (i) minimize and combine administrative costs; and 23 transition the State, counties, municipal corporations, and (ii) 24county boards to new plans, as applicable, without adversely affecting the health benefits of any employee; 2526 (4) recommend whether the State should limit the number of nonprofit 27 organizations that may participate in the State health plan; and 28 (5)make any other recommendations to control health costs and offer a 29 variety of health benefit plan choices.

On or before January 1, 2020, the Task Force shall report its findings and

recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State

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Governor.
