

14 15 16 17 18	(10) Money expended from the Fund for donated recreational licenses or stamps is supplemental to and is not intended to take the place of funding that otherwise would be appropriated for recreational licenses or stamps for use by Gold Star recipients, disabled veterans, disabled members of the armed forces of the United States, or permanently disabled persons who require the use of a wheelchair.

It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 6 years and, at the end of June 30, [2019] 2022, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
24 25 26 27 28	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019. It shall remain effective until the taking effect of the termination provision in Section 4 of Chapter 424 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2016, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act. If that termination provision takes effect, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
