$\frac{2}{3}$	Commercial Driver's Licenses – Recognition, Prevention, and Reporting of Human Trafficking
4	FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to include questions on the
5	recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking as part of the
6	commercial driver's license knowledge test; requiring commercial driver's license
7	training schools to include training on the recognition, prevention, and effective
8	reporting of human trafficking as part of the curriculum; requiring the
9 10	Administration to include content on the recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking in its Commercial Driver's License Manual; requiring
11	the Administration to provide content <u>information</u> on the recognition, prevention,
11	and effective reporting of human trafficking from the Manual to applicants renewing
13	their commercial driver's licenses; and generally relating to commercial driver's

14 licenses.

15	(b) (1) Except as provided in § 16–807.1 of this subtitle, an individual may not
16	be issued a commercial driver's license until the individual has passed the knowledge and
17	skill tests for driving a commercial motor vehicle which complies with the minimum federal
18	standards established by the federal Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986 (Title
19	XII of Public Law 99-570), and has satisfied all other requirements of that act as well as
20	any other requirements of this title.
21	(2) The tests shall be prescribed and conducted at the direction of the
22	Administration AND, IN ADDITION TO FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS, SHALL INCLUDE
23	QUESTIONS ON THE RECOGNITION, PREVENTION, AND EFFECTIVE REPORTING OF
