## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Maryland Department of Health – Capital and Grant Programs – State Grants

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the caps on the percentages of certain costs for the 4 construction, acquisition, renovation, and equipping of community mental health  $\mathbf{5}$ facilities, addiction facilities, and developmental disabilities facilities for which State 6 grants can be provided under the Community Mental Health, Addiction, and 7 Developmental Disabilities Capital Program; increasing the caps on the percentages 8 of certain costs for certain projects that may be covered by State grants under the 9 Federally Qualified Health Centers Grant Program; making stylistic changes; and 10 generally relating to the Community Mental Health, Addiction, and Developmental 11 Disabilities Facilities Capital Program and the Federally Qualified Health Centers 12Grant Program.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
  19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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# Article – Health – General

21 24-604.

22 (a) The allocation and use of State funds under this subtitle are subject to the 23 following terms and conditions.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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1 (b) State funds may be used only for the construction, acquisition, renovation, and 2 equipping of facilities including the reports, plans, specifications, site improvements, 3 surveys, and other related programs.

4 (1) Any federal grant that is available for this purpose shall be applied 5 first to the cost of construction, acquisition, renovation, or equipping of a facility.

6 (2) A State grant shall provide up to [50 percent] **75%** of the eligible cost 7 remaining after the federal grant has been applied.

8 (3) For projects designated under federal regulations, State plans, or the 9 departmental regulations as eligible for poverty area funding, State grants shall amount to 10 up to [75 percent] **90%** of the eligible cost remaining after the federal grant has been 11 applied.

12 (4) For purposes of this subtitle, community development block grant funds 13 shall be considered as local matching funds and may not be considered as federal grant 14 funds.

15 (c) The amount of the State grant for any project shall be determined after 16 consideration of all eligible applications, the total of unallocated State funds available at 17 the time the application is received, and the priorities of area need as may be established 18 by the Department.

- 19 (d) (1) No portion of the proceeds of a State grant may be used:
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[(1)] (I) For the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction; or

[(2)] (II) In connection with the design, acquisition, or construction of any building used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious denomination.

(2) [Upon] ON the request of the Board of Public Works, the applicant shall
 submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the grant have been
 or are being used for a purpose prohibited by this subtitle.

(a) The allocation and use of State funds under this subtitle are subject to theterms and conditions set forth in this section.

30 (b) State funds may only be used for the purposes listed under § 24–1302 of this 31 subtitle and approved by the Secretary under § 24–1303 of this subtitle.

32 (c) The allocation and use of State funds under this subtitle are subject to the 33 following terms and conditions:

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Any federal or other grant that is received for an eligible project shall 1 (1) $\mathbf{2}$ be applied first to the cost of the project;

3 (2)Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a State grant may not exceed [50%] 75% of the cost of eligible work remaining unpaid after all federal grants 4  $\mathbf{5}$ have been applied; and

6 For purposes of this subtitle, community development block grant funds (3)7 shall be considered as local matching funds and may not be considered as federal grant funds. 8

9 (d) For a project designated as eligible for poverty area funding under federal 10 regulations, State plans, or departmental regulations, a State grant may cover up to [75%] **90%** of the cost of eligible work remaining unpaid after all federal grants have been applied. 11

12The amount of the State grant recommended to the Board of Public Works for (e) 13 any project shall be determined after consideration of:

15The total of unallocated State funds available at the time the grant (2)16 recommendation is made to the Board of Public Works; and

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(3)The priorities of area need established by the Department.

18(f) (1)No portion of the proceeds of a State grant may be used:

19 (i) To further sectarian religious instruction;

20(ii) In connection with the design, acquisition, or construction of any 21building to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction; or

22In connection with any program or department of divinity for any (iii) 23religious denomination.

24(2)On the request of the Board of Public Works, the applicant shall submit 25evidence satisfactory to the Board that the proceeds of the grant are not being used for a 26purpose prohibited under this subsection or under applicable federal law.

27Beginning in fiscal year 2007 and continuing every fiscal year thereafter, the (g)28Governor shall include an appropriation in the State capital budget to be distributed and 29managed in accordance with this subtitle.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31October 1, 2019.
