## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Juvenile Law – Jurisdiction – Attempted Carjacking and Attempted Armed Carjacking

- FOR the purpose of providing that the juvenile court does not have jurisdiction over a child
  alleged to have committed attempted carjacking or attempted armed carjacking
  unless the child is of a certain age or a court exercising criminal jurisdiction transfers
  a case to the juvenile court; and generally relating to altering the jurisdiction of the
  juvenile court in certain cases.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
  - Article Courts and Judicial Proceedings

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(a) In addition to the jurisdiction specified in Subtitle 8 of this title, the court has
 exclusive original jurisdiction over:

20 (1) A child who is alleged to be delinquent or in need of supervision or who 21 has received a citation for a violation;

22 (2) Except as provided in subsection (d)(6) of this section, a peace order 23 proceeding in which the respondent is a child; and



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(3)Proceedings arising under the Interstate Compact on Juveniles.

 $\mathbf{2}$ (b) The court has concurrent jurisdiction over proceedings against an adult for 3 the violation of § 3–8A–30 of this subtitle. However, the court may waive its jurisdiction 4 under this subsection upon its own motion or upon the motion of any party to the proceeding, if charges against the adult arising from the same incident are pending in the  $\mathbf{5}$ criminal court. Upon motion by either the State's Attorney or the adult charged under § 6 7 3–8A–30 of this subtitle, the court shall waive its jurisdiction, and the adult shall be tried 8 in the criminal court according to the usual criminal procedure.

9 (c)The jurisdiction of the court is concurrent with that of the District Court in any criminal case arising under the compulsory public school attendance laws of this State. 10

11 (d)

The court does not have jurisdiction over:

12A child at least 14 years old alleged to have done an act which, if (1)13committed by an adult, would be a crime punishable by life imprisonment, as well as all 14other charges against the child arising out of the same incident, unless an order removing 15the proceeding to the court has been filed under § 4–202 of the Criminal Procedure Article;

16 A child at least 16 years old alleged to have done an act in violation of (2)17any provision of the Transportation Article or other traffic law or ordinance, except an act that prescribes a penalty of incarceration; 18

19A child at least 16 years old alleged to have done an act in violation of (3)20any provision of law, rule, or regulation governing the use or operation of a boat, except an 21act that prescribes a penalty of incarceration:

22A child at least 16 years old alleged to have committed any of the (4)23following crimes, as well as all other charges against the child arising out of the same 24incident, unless an order removing the proceeding to the court has been filed under § 254–202 of the Criminal Procedure Article:

- 26(i) Abduction;

- Second degree murder; 28(iii)
- 29Manslaughter, except involuntary manslaughter; (iv)
