## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning 1

## Natural Resources – No Net Loss of Forest – Definition

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the standard for achieving a no net loss of forest policy to 4 measure for forest land by altering the definition of "no net loss of forest"; and  $\mathbf{5}$ generally relating to the State's no net loss of forest policy.

#### 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 17That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- Article Natural Resources 18 195 - 101.
  - 20In this title the following words have the meanings indicated. (a)

21"No net loss of forest" means 40% of all land in Maryland is covered by [tree (i) canopy] FOREST LAND. 22

2 (b) It is the policy of the State to encourage the retention and sustainable 3 management of forest lands by:

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(1) Achieving no net loss of forest;

5 (2) Affording due consideration to the protection and retention of forests in 6 the State through existing land conservation programs where they have the highest value 7 in terms of promoting the State's compliance with its clean water goals under the 2014 8 Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement and the 2007 Forestry Conservation Initiative;

9 (3) Enhancing the retention of privately owned forest lands through 10 research-based educational outreach efforts to landowners by the State's forest 11 conservancy district boards;

12 (4) Developing financial incentives to encourage landowners to retain and 13 manage their forests sustainably and in a manner that is consistent with a forest 14 stewardship plan;

15 (5) Promoting renewable energy policies and markets with increased 16 emphasis on the use of in–State produced woody biomass;

17 (6) Ensuring dual certification of the State's forests by the Forest 18 Stewardship Council and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative;

Recognizing the importance of:

20 (i) A viable forest products industry to the economies of rural 21 Maryland;

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(ii) Continued development of fiber products; and

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(iii) Maryland's green infrastructure; and

(8) Developing and enhancing programs with a sustainable forestry component, including a forest mitigation banking system, a carbon credit or carbon sequestration program, a clean water credit trading system, an environmental services credit trading program, and a renewable energy credit trading system.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 29 October 1, 2019.

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
