BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 20-102.A minor has the same capacity as an adult to consent to medical or dental treatment if the minor: (1)Is married;
