Hospitals - Patient's Bill of Rights

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each administrator of a hospital to provide patients with a 4 certain patient's bill of rights; requiring each administrator of a hospital to provide 5 certain patients with a translator, an interpreter, or another accommodation to 6 provide certain assistance to patients; requiring each administrator of a hospital to 7 conspicuously post copies of the patient's bill of rights on the hospital's website and 8 in areas of the hospital accessible to patients and visitors; requiring each 9 administrator of a hospital to provide annual training to certain staff members to 10 ensure the staff's knowledge and understanding of the patient's bill of rights; requiring a certain statement to be written in plain language; altering the rights 11 12 that are required to be included in a patient's bill of rights; requiring the Office of 13 Health Care Quality to monitor certain compliance; requiring the Office to report to 14 the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; declaring the intent of 15 the General Assembly; defining a certain term; making a technical change; and 16 generally relating to hospitals and a patient's bill of rights.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- [(a)] (C) Each administrator of a hospital [is responsible for making available]

 SHALL:
- 14 **(1) PROVIDE** to each patient in the hospital a **WRITTEN** copy of the patient's bill of rights that [the]:
- (I) THE hospital adopts under [the] Joint Commission [on Accreditation of Hospitals'] guidelines <u>OR GUIDELINES ISSUED BY A NATIONALLY</u>
 RECOGNIZED HOSPITAL ACCREDITATION ORGANIZATION APPROVED BY THE
 CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES CONDITIONS OF
 PARTICIPATION; AND
- 21 (II) COMPLIES WITH SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION;
- 22 (2) If A PATIENT DOES NOT SPEAK ENGLISH, OR REQUIRES THE
 23 PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS IN AN ALTERNATIVE FORMAT, OR IS ILLITERATE,
 24 PROVIDE A TRANSLATOR, AN INTERPRETER, OR ANOTHER ACCOMMODATION TO
 25 ASSIST THE PATIENT IN UNDERSTANDING AND EXERCISING THE RIGHTS INCLUDED
 26 IN THE PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS;
- 27 (3) CONSPICUOUSLY POST COPIES OF THE PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS
 28 ON THE HOSPITAL'S WEBSITE AND IN AREAS OF THE HOSPITAL ACCESSIBLE TO
 29 PATIENTS, INCLUDING THE ADMITTING OFFICE THAT ARE ACCESSIBLE TO PATIENTS
 30 AND VISITORS, WHICH MAY INCLUDE ADMITTING OFFICES, PATIENT FLOORS,
 31 PATIENT ROOMS, THE OUTPATIENT DEPARTMENT, AND EMERGENCY SERVICES
 32 WAITING AREAS; AND

- 1 (4) PROVIDE ANNUAL TRAINING TO ALL PATIENT CARE STAFF 2 MEMBERS TO ENSURE THE STAFF'S KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING OF THE 3 PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS.
- [(b)] (D) The patient's bill of rights shall AT A MINIMUM include a statement, IN PLAIN LANGUAGE, that a patient has a right to [expect and receive appropriate assessment, management, and treatment of pain as an integral component of the patient's care]:
- 8 (1) RECEIVE CONSIDERATE, RESPECTFUL, AND COMPASSIONATE 9 CARE;
- 10 (2) BE PROVIDED CARE IN A SAFE ENVIRONMENT FREE FROM ALL FORMS OF ABUSE AND NEGLECT, INCLUDING VERBAL, MENTAL, PHYSICAL, AND SEXUAL ABUSE;
- 13 (3) HAVE A MEDICAL SCREENING EXAM AND BE PROVIDED 14 STABILIZING TREATMENT FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL CONDITIONS AND LABOR;
- 15 **(4) B**E FREE FROM RESTRAINTS AND SECLUSION UNLESS NEEDED 16 FOR SAFETY;
- 17 (5) BE TOLD THE NAMES AND JOBS OF THE HEALTH CARE TEAM
 18 MEMBERS INVOLVED IN THE PATIENT'S CARE IF STAFF SAFETY IS NOT A CONCERN;
- 19 **(6)** HAVE RESPECT SHOWN FOR THE PATIENT'S PERSONAL VALUES, 20 BELIEFS, AND WISHES;
- 21 (7) BE TREATED WITHOUT DISCRIMINATION BASED ON RACE, COLOR,
- 22 NATIONAL ORIGIN, ETHNICITY, AGE, GENDER, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER
- 23 IDENTITY OR EXPRESSION, PHYSICAL OR MENTAL DISABILITY, RELIGION,
- 24 LANGUAGE, OR ABILITY TO PAY;

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- 25 (8) BE PROVIDED A LIST OF PROTECTIVE AND ADVOCACY SERVICES 26 WHEN NEEDED;
- 27 (9) RECEIVE INFORMATION ABOUT THE PATIENT'S HOSPITAL AND 28 PHYSICIAN CHARGES AND ASK FOR AN ESTIMATE OF HOSPITAL CHARGES BEFORE
- 29 CARE IS PROVIDED AND AS LONG AS PATIENT CARE IS NOT IMPEDED;
- 30 (10) RECEIVE INFORMATION IN A MANNER THAT IS UNDERSTANDABLE 31 BY THE PATIENT, WHICH MAY INCLUDE:
 - (I) SIGN AND FOREIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETERS;

2	AND TREATMENTS;
3 4	(23) BE PROVIDED A COPY OF THE HEALTH INSURANCE PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT NOTICE OF PRIVACY PRACTICES; AND
5	(24) FILE A COMPLAINT ABOUT CARE AND HAVE THE COMPLAINT
6	REVIEWED WITHOUT THE COMPLAINT AFFECTING THE PATIENT'S CARE.
7	(E) THE OFFICE OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY SHALL MONITOR THE
8	COMPLIANCE OF EACH HOSPITAL WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
9 10	(F) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 EACH YEAR, THE OFFICE OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH §
11 12	2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE COMPLIANCE OF HOSPITALS WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
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13 14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2021, the Maryland Department of Health shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance
15	with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the compliance of hospitals with the
16	requirements of this Act.
17 18	SECTION $\stackrel{2}{=}$ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2019.
