1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Wage Payment and Collection Law – Awards of Certain Fees and Costs and Prohibition Against Retaliation

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the court, on a certain finding in an action on behalf of an employee for a violation of the Maryland Wage Payment and Collection Law, to $\mathbf{5}$ award the Attorney General reasonable counsel fees and other costs; authorizing the 6 7 court, on a certain finding in an action by an employee for a violation of the Maryland 8 Wage Payment and Collection Law, to award the employee reasonable counsel fees 9 and other costs; prohibiting an employer from taking certain adverse actions against 10 an employee under certain circumstances; establishing that a certain penalty applies 11 to a violation of this Act; defining a certain term; clarifying certain language; and generally relating to the Maryland Wage Payment and Collection Law. 12

6 (2) In an action brought under subsection (a) of this section, a general 7 contractor on a project for construction services is jointly and severally liable for a violation 8 of this subtitle that is committed by a subcontractor, regardless of whether the 9 subcontractor is in a direct contractual relationship with the general contractor.

10 (3) A subcontractor shall indemnify a general contractor for any wages, 11 damages, interest, penalties, or attorney's fees owed as a result of the subcontractor's 12 violation unless:

(i) indemnification is provided for in a contract between the generalcontractor and the subcontractor; or
