## 1 AN ACT concerning

## On-Site Sewage Disposal Systems - Construction and Inspection Licenses

3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law requiring a person engaged in the 4 business of inspecting an on-site sewage disposal system for a transfer of property 5 to make a certain certification to the Department of the Environment and make 6 certain information available to a person contracting for the inspecting services; 7 prohibiting a person from engaging in the business of constructing or installing an 8 on-site sewage disposal system unless the person holds a certain license issued by 9 the Department; prohibiting a person from engaging in the business of inspecting an on-site sewage disposal system unless the person holds a certain license issued by 10 11 the Department; requiring the Department to establish by regulation certain 12 eligibility criteria and training requirements; requiring an applicant for a certain 13 license to submit a certain application and pay a certain fee to the Department; 14 providing for the interpretation of this Act; and generally relating to on-site sewage 15 disposal systems.

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

#### Article - Environment

- 2 [9–217.1.
- 3 (a) After July 1, 1999, every person engaged in the business of inspecting an on–site sewage disposal system for a transfer of property must certify to the Department of the Environment that the person has completed a course of instruction, approved by the Department, in the proper inspection of on–site sewage disposal systems.
- 7 (b) Every person engaged in the business of inspecting an on-site sewage disposal 8 system for a transfer of property shall make available to persons contracting for the 9 inspection service evidence of completion of the course of instruction.
- 10 (c) The Department shall adopt regulations to implement the provisions of this 11 section.

- 13 (A) (1) A PERSON MAY NOT ENGAGE IN THE BUSINESS OF CONSTRUCTING
  14 OR INSTALLING AN ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM UNLESS THE PERSON HOLDS
  15 A VALID SEPTIC CONSTRUCTION LICENSE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 16 (2) A PERSON MAY NOT ENGAGE IN THE BUSINESS OF INSPECTING AN ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM UNLESS THE PERSON HOLDS A VALID SEPTIC INSPECTION LICENSE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 19 **(B) (1)** SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH **(2)** OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE 20 DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH BY REGULATION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA AND 21 MINIMUM TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR SEPTIC CONSTRUCTION AND INSPECTION 22 LICENSES.
- 23 (2) THE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR A SEPTIC INSPECTION 24 LICENSE SHALL INCLUDE INSTRUCTION ON DETERMINING WHETHER AN ON–SITE 25 SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM:
- 26 (I) IS IN NEED OF REPLACEMENT OR REPAIR; OR
- 27 (II) IS INCONSISTENT WITH STATUTORY OR REGULATORY 28 REQUIREMENTS.
- 29 (C) AN APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL:
- 30 (1) SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT ON THE FORM 31 THE DEPARTMENT PROVIDES; AND

- 1 (2) PAY AN APPLICATION FEE SET BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 2 **(D)** NOTHING IN THIS SECTION MAY BE INTERPRETED TO PREEMPT OR 3 SUPERSEDE ANY PROVISION OF LOCAL LAW.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2019.
