#### 1 AN ACT concerning

## <u>Consumer Protection –</u> Private Career Schools and For–Profit Institutions of Higher Education – Disclosures <del>and Regulation</del>

4 FOR the purpose of requiring private career schools and certain for-profit institutions of  $\mathbf{5}$ higher education to provide certain students with certain information before the 6 student signs an enrollment agreement, completes registration, or makes a financial 7 commitment; requiring certain information to be displayed in a certain manner and 8 on certain websites; prohibiting certain schools and institutions from enrolling 9 certain residents under certain circumstances; providing for the construction of this 10 Act; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to adopt certain regulations on or before a certain date: specifying that certain schools and 11 institutions may not be required to comply with certain provisions until a certain 12fiscal year; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the regulation of 13 disclosures required to be made by private career schools and for-profit institutions 14 of higher education. 15
