## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## Maryland Health Care Commission - Surgical Birth Rate - Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with 4 the Maternal and Child Health Bureau, the Vital Statistics Administration, and interested stakeholders, to conduct a study regarding the surgical birth rate in the State; requiring that the stakeholders consulted during the study include certain persons; requiring the Commission to examine certain matters, research certain programs, and make certain recommendations; requiring the Commission to report its findings and recommendations to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a study of the surgical birth rate in the State.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 12

13 That:

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- 14 The Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the (a) (1) 15 Maternal and Child Health Bureau, the Vital Statistics Administration, and interested 16 stakeholders, shall conduct a study regarding the surgical birth rate in the State.
- 17 (2) The stakeholders consulted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall include: 18
- 19 (i) maternal health practitioners;
- 20 representatives of the Maryland Hospital Association; (ii)
- 21maternal health consumer advocates; and (iii)
- 22 any other stakeholders the Maryland Health Care Commission (iv) 23determines necessary.

- 1 (b) In conducting the study required under subsection (a)(1) of this section, the 2 Maryland Health Care Commission shall:
- 3 (1) examine factors contributing to the State's surgical birth rate, including 4 the rate of elective and nonelective cesarean sections, the rate of primary and repeat 5 cesarean sections, and the rate of vaginal births after cesarean;
- 6 (2) examine increased complications for women and babies in births by 7 cesarean section;
- 8 (3) examine increased health care costs associated with surgical births;
- 9 (4) research programs in other countries, states, and localities that have 10 aimed to reduce the surgical birth rate; and
- 11 (5) make recommendations regarding methods that may be implemented 12 to reduce the surgical birth rate in the State.
- 13 (c) On or before November 1, 2020, the Maryland Health Care Commission shall 14 report its findings and recommendations, including any draft legislation, to the Senate 15 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee, the Senate Finance Committee, 16 and the House Health and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with §
- 17 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
