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BY adding to The Public Local Laws of Baltimore City Section 16-8(d) Article 4 – Public Local Laws of Maryland (1979 Edition and 1997 Supplement and 2000 Supplement, as amended)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article 4 – Baltimore City
16-8.
(b) The authorized number of members of the Department, both police officers and civilian employees, and the compensation to be paid thereto, shall be as provided in the annual Ordinance of Estimates of Baltimore City, but in no event shall any person who was a member of the Department on July 1, 1966, be reduced in salary or compensation, or

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removed or dismissed from the Department except as provided by law.
 (D) (1) BEGINNING ON JANUARY 1, 2022, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE
 COMPOSED OF NOT LESS THAN 20% CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES AND NOT MORE THAN 80%

17 **POLICE OFFICERS.** 

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18 (2) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2022, AND EVERY 6 MONTHS 19 THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF 20 CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES AND POLICE OFFICERS EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO 21 THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 22 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE MEMBERS OF THE BALTIMORE 23 CITY DELEGATION TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
