University System of Maryland – Board of Regents – Transparency and Oversight

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Board of Regents of the University $\mathbf{5}$ System of Maryland; requiring the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 6 House of Delegates to appoint certain members to the Board; requiring the Senate 7 to consider appointees to the Board collectively during a certain period of time to 8 ensure a certain balance of membership; requiring the Governor to notify the Senate 9 of certain appointments; specifying when the Board shall elect a chairperson; 10 requiring the chairperson, except under certain circumstances, to serve in the 11 position subject to the advice and consent of the Senate; altering the term of the

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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31 (a) (1) There is a body corporate and politic known as the University System 32 of Maryland.

33 (2) The University is an instrumentality of the State and a public34 corporation.

35 (3) The University is an independent unit of State government.

36 (4) The exercise by the University of the powers conferred by this subtitle 37 is the performance of an essential public function.

The government of the University System of Maryland is vested in the Board 1 (b) $\mathbf{2}$ of Regents of the University System of Maryland. 3 The Board of Regents consists of [17] **21** members as follows: (c) 4 Except as provided in item (ii) of this item, [one member] TWO (1)(i) MEMBERS shall be [a] full-time [student] STUDENTS in good academic standing at an $\mathbf{5}$ institution under the jurisdiction of the Board; and 6 7 (ii) A student member who is in good academic standing at the 8 University of Maryland University College shall be exempt from the full-time student 9 requirement in item (i) of this item; 10 One member shall be the [State] Secretary of Agriculture ex officio; (2)11 and 12(3) **ONE MEMBER SHALL BE THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE EX** 13**OFFICIO;** 14(4) **ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE** 15SENATE; 16 **ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE** (5) 17HOUSE; AND **[**(3)**] (6)** The remaining members of the Board shall be residents of the 18 19 State [and], shall be appointed from the general public, AND SHALL INCLUDE AT LEAST: 20**ONE INDIVIDUAL WITH A BACKGROUND IN HIGHER (I)** 21**EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION;** 22**(II) ONE INDIVIDUAL WITH A BACKGROUND IN FINANCE; AND** (III) ONE INDIVIDUAL WITH A BACKGROUND IN DIVERSITY AND 2324WORKPLACE INCLUSION. 25(d) In making appointments to the Board, the Governor, THE PRESIDENT OF 26THE SENATE, AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE shall consider representation from all 27parts of the State. 28(e) (1) [Except for the Secretary of Agriculture, each] EACH member of the 29Board APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (C)(1) AND (6) OF THIS SECTION shall be

30 appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

1 (2) AFTER THE 40TH DAY, AND BEFORE THE 80TH DAY, FROM THE 2 COMMENCEMENT OF EACH REGULAR SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE 3 SENATE SHALL CONSIDER EACH YEAR'S APPOINTEES TO THE BOARD COLLECTIVELY 4 TO ENSURE ADEQUATE BALANCE OF MEMBERSHIP.

5 (f) (1) Except for the student [member] MEMBERS, each appointed member 6 serves for a term of 5 years from July 1 of the year of appointment and until a successor is 7 appointed and qualifies. These members may be reappointed.

8 (2) The student [member] MEMBERS shall be appointed for a term of [1 9 year] 2 YEARS, from July 1, and may be reappointed if the student remains a student at 10 any campus of the University System of Maryland.

11 (3) A member appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term serves only 12 for the remainder of that term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

(g) (1) (I) Except for the Secretary of Agriculture AND THE SECRETARY
 OF COMMERCE, and subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a member may not serve
 more than 2 consecutive full terms.

16 (II) AT THE EXPIRATION OF EACH MEMBER'S FULL TERM, THE 17 GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A REPLACEMENT MEMBER OR SHALL SUBMIT A LETTER 18 TO THE SENATE IN ORDER TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE EXISTING MEMBER.

19 (2) The unexpired or partial term of a member appointed to fill a vacancy 20 occurring during a 5-year term does not qualify as a full term for the newly appointed 21 member.
