- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that a covered employee or a dependent of a covered employee is not entitled to compensation or benefits under the workers' compensation law if a 4 5 certain accidental personal injury, compensable hernia, or occupational disease was 6 caused solely by the effect of medical cannabis on the employee and the medical 7 cannabis was not administered or taken with the written certification or a 8 certifying provider or the written instructions of a physician; including medical 9 cannabis in the medicine that an employer or its insurer is required to provide to a 10 covered employee under certain circumstances; providing for the application of this 11 Act; and generally relating to compensation or benefits under workers' compensation 12 law.
