- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 17 (a) **(1)** Except as provided in § 8–708.1 of this subtitle, projects for dredging and marking channels and harbors, construction of jetties and breakwaters, and clearing

5 6 7	(2) Any funds available from the federal government, any governing body, or any gift also may be used for [these] THE purposes INCLUDED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
8 9 10 11	(b) (1) Except for the construction of pump—out stations for use by the general boating public at public and private marinas, the governing body and the Waterway Improvement Fund jointly shall finance projects to construct marine facilities beneficial to the boating public.
12 13 14	(2) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE contribution of the Waterway Improvement Fund shall be limited to not more than 50% of the cost of each project.
15 16 17	(3) [However, the] THE Waterway Improvement Fund may finance completely any construction project beneficial to the boating public which costs [less than \$100,000] \$250,000 OR LESS, regardless of its location.
18 19	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
