Preamble

14 WHEREAS, Both Harriet Tubman and Frederick Douglass were abolitionists and

15political activists in the late 1800's whose contributions were instrumental in the fight

16 against slavery; and

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1 WHEREAS, Both Tubman and Douglass have roots in Maryland, Tubman having 2 been born a slave in Dorchester County, Maryland and Douglass having escaped from 3 slavery in Talbot County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, Tubman's efforts in the operation of the Underground Railroad resulted in 13 missions that rescued and freed approximately 70 enslaved individuals including family, friends, and others; and

7 WHEREAS, Douglass was a well-known orator, writer, and statesman who 8 published multiple autobiographies that were influential in promoting the cause of 9 abolition; and

WHEREAS, The State of Maryland celebrates Black History Month in the month of
February every year; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (c) (3) The public schools shall devote a part of the day to appropriate exercises 17 for the following [days]:

- 18 (i) Washington's Birthday;
- 19 (ii) Lincoln's Birthday;
- 20 (iii) Veterans' Day;
- 21 (iv) Columbus Day;
- 22 (v) Arbor Day; [and]

(VI) BLACK HISTORY MONTH, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON HARRIET TUBMAN AND FREDERICK DOUGLASS AND THE CONTRIBUTIONS THEY MADE IN THE FIGHT AGAINST SLAVERY; AND

26 [(vi)] (VII) Any other day of national significance.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 October 1, 2019.

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
