A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Health Care Practitioners – Medical Examinations on Anesthetized or**
3 **Unconscious Patients**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting health care practitioners and certain students and trainees
5 from performing certain examinations on a patient who is under anesthesia or
6 unconscious unless the health care practitioner, student, or trainee obtained
7 informed consent from the patient for the examination, the performance of the
8 examination is within the scope of care for the patient, or the patient is unconscious
9 and the examination is required for diagnostic purposes; authorizing certain health
10 occupations boards to take certain actions against certain health care practitioners
11 under certain circumstances and in accordance with certain hearing provisions;
12 defining a certain term; and generally relating to medical examinations on
13 anesthetized or unconscious patients.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Health Occupations**

22 **1–221.1.**

23 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER” MEANS A PERSON**
24 **WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED UNDER THE HEALTH**
25 **OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN THE ORDINARY**

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 COURSE OF BUSINESS OR PRACTICE OF A PROFESSION.

2 (B) A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER, OR A STUDENT OR TRAINEE IN AN
3 EDUCATIONAL OR TRAINING PROGRAM TO BECOME A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER,
4 MAY NOT PERFORM A PELVIC, PROSTATE, OR RECTAL EXAMINATION ON A PATIENT
5 WHO IS UNDER ANESTHESIA OR UNCONSCIOUS UNLESS:

6 (1) THE HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER, STUDENT, OR TRAINEE
7 OBTAINED INFORMED CONSENT FROM THE PATIENT FOR THE EXAMINATION;

8 (2) THE PERFORMANCE OF THE EXAMINATION IS WITHIN THE SCOPE
9 OF CARE FOR THE PATIENT; OR

10 (3) THE PATIENT IS UNCONSCIOUS AND THE EXAMINATION IS
11 REQUIRED FOR DIAGNOSTIC OR TREATMENT PURPOSES.

12 (C) A HEALTH OCCUPATIONS BOARD, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE HEARING
13 PROCEDURES THAT GOVERN THE DISCIPLINE OF THE HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER
14 UNDER THE BOARD'S JURISDICTION, MAY REPRIMAND, PLACE ON PROBATION, OR
15 SUSPEND OR REVOKE A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF A HEALTH CARE
16 PRACTITIONER UNDER THE BOARD'S JURISDICTION WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH
17 THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 October 1, 2019.
