A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Public School Students - Vision Services and the Vision for Maryland Program

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to coordinate with the Vision 4 for Maryland Program to ensure that certain students are able to receive eye 5 examinations and, if necessary, eyeglasses; requiring each county board or county 6 health department to provide eye examinations for certain students; establishing the 7 Vision for Maryland Program; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to carry 8 out the Program in consultation with certain entities; requiring the Program to 9 provide eye examinations and eyeglasses to certain students under certain circumstances; requiring certain services to be provided in a certain manner; 10 11 authorizing the Program to receive funding from certain sources; requiring the 12 Program to report certain information to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; and generally relating to vision services for 13 14 students in public schools.

A list of at-risk groups that are encouraged to have a 29comprehensive eye examination by an optometrist or ophthalmologist; and

Reported to the county board or the county health department.

- 1 (2) Additional information shall be provided to the parents or guardians of 2 a student who fails the vision screening that includes:
- 3 (i) Notice that the results of the screening indicate that the student 4 may have a vision disorder;
- 5 (ii) A recommendation to the parent or guardian that the student be 6 tested by an optometrist or ophthalmologist;
- 7 (iii) A description of the warning signs, symptoms, risk factors, and 8 behavioral problems associated with vision disorders or eye conditions;
- 9 (iv) A description of the difference between eye examinations and the 10 vision screenings required under this section;
- 11 (v) Information on how to enroll in the Maryland Medical Assistance 12 Program; and
- 13 (vi) Information on locally available free or low-cost nonprofit 14 programs that provide eye examinations and eyeglasses for children, if any.
- 15 (D) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE VISION FOR
 16 MARYLAND PROGRAM UNDER § 13–3901 OF THE HEALTH GENERAL ARTICLE TO

- 9 (4) ANY OTHER GRANTS OR CONTRIBUTIONS FROM PUBLIC OR 10 PRIVATE ENTITIES.
