A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Transportation Authority Police – Collective Bargaining – Binding Recommendations of Fact Finder

- FOR the purpose of requiring that the written recommendations of a fact finder be binding
 in a collective bargaining dispute between the Maryland Transportation Authority
 and the exclusive representative of certain Maryland Transportation Authority
 police officers; and generally relating to collective bargaining for Maryland
 Transportation Authority police.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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Article – State Personnel and Pensions

17 3–501.

18 (a) (1) The following individuals or entities shall designate one or more 19 representatives to participate as a party in collective bargaining on behalf of the State or 20 the following institutions:

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(i) on behalf of the State, the Governor;

(ii) on behalf of a system institution, the president of the systeminstitution; and

1 (iii) on behalf of Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of 2 Maryland, or Baltimore City Community College, the governing board of the institution.

3 (2) The exclusive representative shall designate one or more 4 representatives to participate as a party in collective bargaining on behalf of the exclusive 5 representative.

6 (b) The parties shall meet at reasonable times and engage in collective bargaining 7 in good faith to conclude a written memorandum of understanding or other written 8 understanding as defined under § 3–101(c)(1)(ii) of this title.

9 (c) (1) The parties shall make every reasonable effort to conclude negotiations 10 in a timely manner for inclusion by the principal unit in its budget request to the Governor.

11 (2) (i) The parties shall conclude negotiations before January 1 for any 12 item requiring an appropriation of funds for the fiscal year that begins on the following 13 July 1.

(ii) In the budget bill submitted to the General Assembly, the Governor shall include any amounts in the budgets of the principal units required to accommodate any additional cost resulting from the negotiations, including the actuarial impact of any legislative changes to any of the State pension or retirement systems that are required, as a result of the negotiations, for the fiscal year beginning the following July 1 if the legislative changes have been negotiated to become effective in that fiscal year.

20 (3) (i) If the parties do not conclude negotiations for the next fiscal year 21 before October 25, either party may request that a fact finder be employed to resolve the 22 issues.

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(ii) The fact finder shall be employed no later than November 1.

24 (iii) A fact finder shall be a neutral party appointed by alternate 25 striking from a list by the parties provided:

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1. by the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service; or

27 2. under the Labor Arbitration Rules of the American28 Arbitration Association.

29 (iv) The fact finder:

may give notice and hold hearings in accordance with the
 Administrative Procedure Act;

32 2. may administer oaths and take testimony and other 33 evidence;

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2019.
