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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Frederick County – Alcoholic Beverages – Theater Licenses – Seating Capacity**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain seating capacity requirement for theaters in  
4 Frederick County for which the Board of License Commissioners may issue a license  
5 to sell beer and wine; and generally relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages by  
6 theaters in Frederick County.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

2 This title applies only in Frederick County.

3 20-1014.

4 (a) There is a Class C (theater) beer and wine license.

5 (b) (1) The president and two other officers of the theater shall sign the  
6 application for the license.

7 (2) Two of the signers shall be residents of the county.

8 (c) The Board may issue a license for use by a theater with seating [for 200 or  
9 fewer individuals per performance].

10 (d) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer and wine for on-premises  
11 consumption from 1 hour before to 1 hour after:

12 (1) a regular performance; or

13 (2) a fund-raiser performance that benefits the theater.

14 (e) The annual license fee is \$100.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
16 1, 2019.
