A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists – Licensure, Criminal History Records Checks, and Trainee Status – Revisions

FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the credit hours or educational 4 $\mathbf{5}$ requirements completed by certain applicants to be licensed by the State Board of 6 Professional Counselors and Therapists be accredited by the American Art Therapy 7 Association; requiring certain applicants to pass an examination approved by the 8 Board, rather than the Art Therapy Credentials Board Exam; requiring an applicant 9 for trainee status to submit certain information to the Board, pay a certain fee, and 10 submit to a criminal history records check; repealing authorization for the Board to 11 accept an alternate method of a criminal history records check under certain 12circumstances; requiring the Central Repository to forward to the Board and to 13 certain individuals certain information under certain circumstances; altering the 14 information that must be included by the Board on each license and certificate; 15requiring the Board to maintain a certain electronic roster for a certain purpose; 16authorizing certain individuals to contact the Board to verify a license or certificate; 17repealing the requirement for a licensee or certificate holder to display the license or 18 certificate in a certain manner; making certain provisions of law governing the 19denial, probation, suspension, reprimand, or revocation of licenses and certificates 20applicable to certain trainees; making conforming changes; repealing certain 21 obsolete language; and generally relating to professional counselors and therapists.

2 (e) The applicant shall provide documentation to the Board evidencing the 3 completion of any educational requirements established by the Board in regulation, from 4 an accredited college or university program that is [accredited by the American Art 5 Therapy Association,] approved by the Board.

6 (f) The applicant shall provide documentation evidencing the completion of 2 7 years of postgraduate supervised experience as required by the Board.

8 (g) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass [the Art 9 Therapy Credentials Board Exam] AN EXAMINATION APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

11 The Board shall waive the requirements for the practice of licensed clinical 12 professional art therapy under § 17–304.1(d) through (g) of this subtitle if, on or before 13 October 1, 2014, the applicant provides the Board with documentation showing:

(1) Current certification by the Art Therapy Credentials Board, Inc.; and

- 15 (2) Completion of 3 years of full-time experience providing art therapy.]

17 To apply for **TRAINEE STATUS**, a license, or **A** certificate, an applicant shall:

18 (1) Submit an application on the form that the Board requires;

19 (2) Pay to the Board the application fee set by the Board; and

20 (3) Submit to a criminal history records check in accordance with § 21 17–501.1 of this subtitle.

[(d) If an applicant has made three or more unsuccessful attempts at securing legible fingerprints, the Board may accept an alternate method of a criminal history records check as allowed by the Director of the Central Repository and the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.]
