A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Service Commission - Recapture and Redirection of Funds

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission to recapture certain money 4 expended from a certain quasi-endowment Energy Assistance Fund that was 5 granted in accordance with a certain order of the Commission; requiring the 6 Commission to redirect certain money granted to a certain entity in accordance with 7 a certain order of the Commission to an entity to administer the funds in a certain 8 manner; requiring the entity selected by the Commission to administer certain funds 9 to meet certain qualifications; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally 10 relating to the recapture and redirection of certain funds awarded by the Public 11 Service Commission.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That:
- 14 (a) The Public Service Commission shall:
- 15 (1) recapture from the Fuel Fund of Maryland any money expended 16 without the Commission's approval from the principal granted to the quasi-endowment 17 Energy Assistance Fund in accordance with Commission Order No. 85187, dated November
- 18 8, 2012; and
- 19 (2) redirect the money granted to the quasi-endowment Energy Assistance 20 Fund administered by the Fuel Fund of Maryland in accordance with Order No. 85187 to 21 an entity that will administer the funds:
- 22 (i) subject to the same terms and conditions under which the money 23 was originally granted in accordance with Order No. 85187; and

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- 1 (ii) in accordance with the policies set forth in Order No. 85187 2 required of programs designed to deliver long-term economic benefits to the residential and 3 business customers in the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company service territory.
 - (b) (1) The entity selected by the Commission to administer the funds shall be either a State agency or a nonprofit organization.
 - (2) If the entity is a nonprofit organization, it shall present proof to the Commission that the organization spends at least 50% of its annual revenue on energy assistance programs.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
