The Bee Hive is an historic property with structures dating to the 17th and 18th centuries. Together with a nearby mill it was an important resource during the Revolutionary War for local families as well as the American army. At present it contains a harness makers shop (also referred to locally as an armory and may have served as both), a tavern, a dwelling (Fence Makers House), and a cooperage. Parts of the mill remain on an adjacent privately owned property. This is a unique and historically significant group of buildings. We hope to preserve and maintain it as a place for the community to come together to understand and celebrate their shared history. With improvements and restoration of the Fence Makers House we will have an opportunity to offer more events and educational programming to engage the public. The Bee Hive will have the ability to serve a larger portion of the community.
