<p>The FMM has a fifty year old 'service record' of being the best steward of the fire service history in the State of Maryland. While we specialize in the technology that keeps us safe, we tell the story of the men and women who invented, made and used these machines. Our mission is to collect, restore and interpret this assortment of material for the citizens of Maryland so that we might be better citizens in the future. 14,000 school children and visitors benefited from our staffing and collections in 2018. A third of the 40 fire apparatus is kept in working condition and people may access these artifacts on special days and via movies at other times. There are over 12,000 images in the archives. We teach about fire safety, STEM and curricula, career choices, and of course the stories of the people who serve (d) in the American Fire Service.</p>		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)**

To design and install a sprinkler system to protect the entire 23,200 sq. ft. (two buildings) collection from destruction by fire. State and County fire codes require an 8" main to be laid in from Greenridge Road, feeding a new hydrant and independent sprinkler system in each building. Due to the sensitivity of the paper in the archives, we are investigating a new Novec gaseous system which might be far superior to water, but otherwise there has to be a water system that has a double lock and release control to minimize water damage. The purpose of said project is to provide the best possible protection to this irreplaceable collection. Its installation is long-overdue but money has not been available until now.
