10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)					

Frederick Bocce began in 2014 as a small informal group meeting to play bocce. In 2018 as we began the process of designing bocce courts, we became a working group under Friends of Baker Park, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit. Friends of Baker Park acts as our fiscal agent for the construction of the bocce courts. The mission of Frederick Bocce is to create a public space in which our diverse community can come together and enjoy the game of bocce; to add a handicapped accessible recreational amenity to Baker Park; to promote and teach the game of bocce without cost to anyone who has an interest, regardless of ability. 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

To build four permanent bocce courts in Baker Park, Room 1 across from the Carillon. Baker Park is a 58 acre linear park running through the heart of downtown Frederick. These courts will allow the general public to play bocce in most weather conditions, year round. The planned bocce court venue include lighting, low maintenance materials, eight benches, two picnic pavilions and accessibility for wheelchairs. The courts will be regulation size which allows them to be used for local and regional tournaments. The City has approved the proposal and has provided the land for the courts. The plan design has also been approved by the Historical Preservation Commission. Frederick will provide the labor for the 8 to 10 week build-out, which is estimated to be \$150,000. Frederick Bocce is responsible for raising the funds necessary to purchase the materials, which is estimated to be \$104,000.

Not only is bocce a great game for all ages and skill levels, but it can also be a social and economic driver in a community by providing a venue for promoting healthy activities for an aging population, cultivating strong social relationships, networking and corporate team building events, bocce league and tournament play and special events.

Once built the bocce courts will be an asset of Frederick City Parks and Recreation, and as such they will be open to the general public. Wheelchairs will be able to access the courts via a paved walkway.

Bocce is a global game and enjoyed by all age groups, young and old. The Frederick Senior Recreation Council supports building bocce courts in Baker Park, as do local advocates for Community Living and Special Olympics. Bocce is one of the Special Olympics Unified Sports which is played in all ten Frederick County High Schools. Unified Sports pair ablebodied and disabled individuals on a team to compete in certain sports. Tournaments are held annually and are supported by Special Olympics Maryland Frederick County.
