Howard County Government via the Howard County Department of Recreation & Parks. The Howard County Department of Recreation & Parks is responsible for the stewardship of over 9,200 acres of public lands, the maintenance and operation of more than 50 parks, and offering 7,000 recreational programs. The mission of the Department is to responsibly manage natural resources; provide excellent parks, facilities, and recreation opportunities for the community; and ensure the highest quality of life for current and future generations.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Howard County is requesting a \$100,000.00 Bond Bill Grant for the relocation, design, construction, rehabilitation, and equipping of the historic Thomas Isaac Log Cabin, located within the historic district of Ellicott City and the Patapsco Valley Heritage Area. This structure is the oldest heritage site along Main Street in Historic Ellicott City. The cabin served as a landmark for the African American community as an important meeting place in the 1800's. As a result of the 2018 Ellicott City Flood, this structure must be relocated to an alternative site in town until a permanent location can be established. The Thomas Isaac Log Cabin was constructed in 1780, previously relocated in 1987, and remains important to the history, character, tourism, and post-flood recovery of Ellicott City.
