The Three Notch Theater located in Lexington Park, Maryland, is home to The Newtowne Players, Inc. The Newtowne Players' mission is to promote all aspects of the performing arts in Southern Maryland. Whether their interests are performing, directing, writing, make-up, costume design or technical support, The Newtowne Players provide opportunities for all through education and hands-on experience of working as a volunteer in any facets of theater. In the process, The Newtowne Players promote and increase the public's knowledge and appreciation of arts and cultural activities in Southern Maryland.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

State bond funding will be used for the following infrastructure improvements to enhance public access and deliver a better experience to the theater-going public: 1. Modernize inadequate restroom facilities, replace lobby flooring and reconstruct the theater's entrance to enhance accessibility and ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. 2. Upgrade the air conditioning system to cool theater waiting areas. 3. Upgrade the electrical system and add security lighting to the exterior of the building. 4. Enclose the unused vestibule to provide additional security and storage. 5. Redesign and improve the theater's support areas. 6. Repair the parking lot immediately adjacent to the theater to improve pedestrian and vehicular safety and increase handicapped spaces.

28. Comments

The Three Notch Theater is the home of The Newtowne Players (TNP). TNP is a volunteer, non-profit organization whose mission is to promote all aspects of the performing arts in Southern Maryland. TNP provides live community theater including musicals, comedies and dramas to the general public at the Three Notch Theater. TNP also forged a partnership with Historic St. Mary's City to produce a Shakespeare play on the grounds of Maryland's original state house each summer.

If approved, bond funding will be used for infrastructure improvements to the theater to enhance public accessibility and deliver a better experience to the theater-going public. The project entails modernizing restrooms, replacing flooring in the lobby, and reconstructing the theater's entrance to comply with the Americans with Disabilites Act. The air conditioning system in the theater waiting areas will be upgraded. Electrical systems will be updated and security lighting added on the perimeter of the building. An unused vestibule will be gated and partially enclosed to increase security and storage for the theater, and support areas improved. The parking lot will be resurfaced to improve pedestrian and vehicular safety and increase the number of handicapped spaces.

BACKGROUND: TNP executed its first lease with the Commissioners of St. Mary's County for use of surplus property - the former Lexington Park Library - in 2004. The term of the lease is six years and there are options to renew.

TNP accepted the building in "as is" condition. All renovations and structural changes to the building are TNP's responsibility as are all operating costs for the theater. TNP transformed the former library building into a theater including an auditorium with theater-style seating to accommodate 120 patrons, a stage, a lighting and sound booth, a shop, and properties room. The library's storage areas were converted into a green room and dressing room for the actors, while the offices were reconstructed to accommodate the theater's lobby and ticket sales and production offices. 2005 was TNP's inaugural season at the Three Notch Theater.

Since the inaugural season, TNP has upgraded the flooring in the auditorum, renovated a freestanding restroom for handicapped accessibility, constructed a handicapped ramp to the back of the stage to enhance access for individuals with limited mobility, and improved air conditioning in the theater's auditorium. TNP offers listening-assisted devices for those with hearing impairment, sign language interpretation during the annual Shakespeare play, and now holds a private show for special needs audiences every year at the Three Notch Theater. As the company's committment to accommodate special needs patrons continues to grow, bond funding will allow TNP to complete much needed improvements to improve access and enhance the Three Notch Theater for the general public.
