(Chair, Ways and Means Committee)(By Request - Departmental - State Board of Elections)

Ways and Means

Election Law - Absentee Ballot Requests - Last Four Digits of Social Security Number

This departmental bill requires an absent uniformed services or overseas voter, or a voter with a disability, to provide only the last four digits of the voter's Social Security number, rather than the voter's full Social Security number, in instances where the voter uses the online absentee ballot application to request that an absentee ballot be sent by any method or who uses any method to request to receive a blank absentee ballot through the Internet, and does not have a Maryland driver's license or Maryland identification card. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2019.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: The bill does not affect local government finances.

Small Business Effect: The State Board of Elections (SBE) has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). The Department of Legislative Services concurs with this assessment.

Analysis

Current Law: A voter who uses the online absentee ballot application to request that an absentee ballot be sent by any method or who uses any method to request to receive a blank absentee ballot through the Internet must provide:

- a Maryland driver's license number or Maryland identification card number, the last four digits of the applicant's Social Security number, and other information identified by SBE that is not generally available to the public but is readily available to the applicant; or
- if the applicant is an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter as defined in the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act or a voter with a disability and does not have a Maryland driver's license or Maryland identification card, a Social Security number.

Background: SBE indicates that the bill conforms statute to SBE policy and regulations. SBE regulations require an absent uniformed services or overseas voter, who does not have a Maryland driver's license or Motor Vehicle Administration identification card number, to provide the last four digits of the voter's Social Security number on an online absentee ballot application. SBE also eliminated its ability to retain full Social Security numbers in the voter registration system, in January 2017, in response to an audit finding that personally identifiable information (full Social Security numbers) of some voters was being unnecessarily retained within the system.
