Election Law - Judicial Proceedings Involving Local Boards of Elections - Notice

This departmental bill eliminates a requirement that a copy of a specified complaint or other pleading provided by a local board of elections to the State Board of Elections (SBE) be provided by certified mail.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: The bill does not materially affect local government finances.

Small Business Effect: SBE has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). The Department of Legislative Services concurs with this assessment.

Analysis

Current Law: In any judicial proceeding in which a local board is a party, SBE: (1) immediately after the action has been filed, must be provided, by certified mail by the local board, with a copy of the complaint or other pleading that initiated the proceeding and (2) may join as a party to the proceeding.

Background: SBE indicates that the certified mail requirement is obsolete and the removal of the requirement allows the local boards of elections to provide to SBE a complaint or other pleading initiating a judicial proceeding through various methods.
